

# Post-doc in Computer Science at University of Michigan:

We are seeking an energetic postdoctoral researcher to both conduct and lead transformative research in the field of social network analysis. Funding is coming from [an NSF grant on social influence](#).

A wide range of applications will be considered, and successful applications could come from a variety of backgrounds (e.g. theoretical computer science, sociology, etc). However, previous experience related to one or more of the following areas is expected: social network analysis, theory of computation, intersection of economics and computer science, large-scale social experiments.

The postdoc will be mentored by [Prof. Grant Schoenebeck](#) (University of Michigan) and [Prof. Jie Gao](#) (SUNY Stony Brook).

Expected starting date is Fall 2016, but earlier starting dates are also possible.

Initially 1-year, the position may be renewable with additional funding. Salary will be competitive for experience of candidate. Health insurance will be provided.

Applications will be considered as they arrive (until the position is filled). However, we encourage applications to be submitted by Feb 15, 2016.
